Biographical information:

The Weston farm (approximately 600 acres) was settled in Madison, Maine, around 1786 by Deacon Benjamin Weston (see "Weston Homestead Farm" booklet for more detailed information about the farm and the Weston family, including genealogy of the first generations). The original Weston Homestead was built by Ephraim Spaulding for Benjamin Weston. By the time Benjamin's grandson, Theodore, was running the farm around 1873, the family raised hay, grain, cattle and sheep, and sold cord wood and lumber. Later there was a dairy. In 1886 the family celebrated the centennial of the Weston Homestead (and in 1986 the family celebrated the bicentennial of the homestead).

In 1974 seven of the heirs formed the Weston Homestead Farm Corporation. In 1977 the Weston Homestead was entered on the National Register of Historic Places. The farmstead is still owned by the family, who use it seasonally, as well as a setting for their annual family reunion/meeting held every August, although it was put on the market in 2013. The 50 acres of farmland will be preserved through the Maine Farmland Trust.

This collection really begins with Benjamin's grandson, Theodore B. Weston (1846-1929) and his wife, Addie S. Bixby Weston (1850-1919). Indeed, Addie appears to be the focal point of the collection, with the majority of letters either to or from her. She was a published writer and contributed to several publications including the "Ladies Home Journal," "Good Housekeeping,"

and "Maine Farmer," using the pen names "Clarissa Potter" and "Helen Ayre." Some of the correspondence has to do with her writing, as well as her farm business (dealing in cats, eggs, etc.). Before her marriage she was a teacher.

Addie's husband Theodore (son of Nathan, Benjamin's son) appears in a more minimal way in her correspondence, as some of the letters are addressed to them both (such as "Home folks" or "House folks" by their children). Theodore's diaries and farm financial records, however, are his contribution to the collection (Boxes 92-98).

Their son and three daughters also figure prominently. Son Wallace Augustus (1877-1931) graduated from the University of Maine in Orono in 1900 with a degree in civil engineering. On September 2nd, 1907, he married his wife Nettie (1879-1966). They moved around a bit, including living on the West Coast. So, between 1900 and 1915, there were many letters between the family at home and Wallace and Nettie in various places. In 1915 Wallace and Nettie returned home to work on the farm with Theodore.

Daughter Eva "Evie" Isabel (1881-1966) never married, and attended nursing school (Chautaqua School of Nursing), probably through a correspondence course. Some of her school and nursing records can be found in the collection. Daughter Alice Elizabeth Todd (1884-1957) gave instruction in vocal and instrumental music before her marriage. Daughter Mary "Mazie" Bixby Crowell (1888-1945) attended Colby College and writes letters from college home, as well as after her marriage to Allan Crowell (1884-1946). Mazie and Allan were married in 1915.

Some of the grandchildren of Theodore and Addie are represented, especially Eunice (b. 1921) and Eula (b. 1920), the daughters of Alice Todd, as well as Barbara Louise Crowell Hennig (b. 1925), daughter of Mazie Crowell.

There are also some other Westons represented, such as Theodore's sister Annie, brother Nathan Augustus, and brother George O. (and his wife Lizzie or Lyll).

Addie Weston's family members also figure prominently in the collection: her father, Jotham S. (1810-1886) and mother Mary Wood Bixby (1817-1873), and her sisters Isabel "Belle" Frances (1844-1912), Emma Embury (1846-1886), Mary Elizabeth "Lizzie" or "Lyll" or "Lily" (1848-1901), and Hattie Nancy (1857-1890). Belle is the only sister to marry; Emma and Hattie died relatively young. For that reason Belle's writings are more numerous than the other sisters. Her husband, Dr. David Elkins Parsons (d. 1907), is also prominent. They were married in 1872. He served as a Captain in the Civil War in the 19th Maine Volunteer Infantry Regiment, so his documents reflect not only that time, but also his involvement in the Grand Army of the Republic (G.A.R.) for years to come. There are also some of his medical records. The Parsons lived in Oakland, Maine.

Addie's father, Jotham S. Bixby, in addition to being a farmer, was "a dealer in the best pianos, organs, & melodeons in the market." Related business records are included. Jotham married Mary Wood October 24, 1843. Mary was born September 25, 1817 and died August 22, 1873.

Overall, this collection is a rich representation of a 19th century farm in central Maine, and several generations of the family that lived there.

Scope and content:

The majority of this collection is letters. The photographs also comprise a large portion of the collection. Other materials include diaries, journals/account books, school papers, printed materials (books, newspapers, pamphlets, catalogs), ephemera (calling cards, greeting cards, sewing patterns, broadsides, etc.) and some objects.

Processing Note:

The collection arrived in various trunks, totes, and boxes – these were returned to the family after being rehoused into archival boxes. An inventory was created by the donor of the contents of the various containers, but there really was no original order. We did try to retain the order that was created within, however, such as groups of letters. But in the end we decided to arrange by type, and then within type by person. Within the larger collections by person it was arranged by date.

Barbara Hennig, daughter of Mazie Weston Crowell transcribed many letters of the Weston Homestead Farm Corporation collection. These transcriptions and their originals begin in Box 64 and end in Box 71. When looking for an example of the collection as a whole or for examples of transcription, please refer to this section of the correspondence series.

In 2019 some of the box contents were condensed, so some of the original Box and folders were changed.

In museum:

1. A large box, which may date from about 1830-1840, belonged to the Wood family, according to the materials in the box (see below). The box is connected to the Weston family by way of Mary Wood Bixby, mother of Addie Weston. Addie and Theodore are the key figures in the Weston Homestead collection (Coll. 2650), with correspondence, photographs, and other materials related to the family, which includes the children and grandchildren of Addie and Theodore, as well as siblings, especially Addie's sisters. About 3 boxes (1.5 linear ft. of the collection pertain to Addie's parents, Mary (b.1817)

d.1873) and Jotham Bixby (b.1810 d.1886), of Norridgewock. The Wood family is well represented in the collection, including letters and photographs. In fact they seem to be intertwined (intermarried) with the Bixbys and Westons. The box could really have belonged to any of the Woods before Mary Wood Bixby. Names mentioned in the contents include: John Wood and his wife Anna Gott Wood, and their sons Artemas H., Nathan, and John Mason Wood. Artemas H. Wood is the father of Lizzie Wood Bixby, who married George O. Weston. Wood genealogies can be found in Box 119. See Box 106 and 107 for removed contents.

2. A small writing desk, which probably belonged to Evie Weston, Addie's daughter, and perhaps actually belonged to Addie before that, given that Evie never married and stayed on the homestead for the remainder of her life.

Contents of the desk include a stamp with "W" on it, a small corked bottle with a "A sure cure for love" compound in it, loose pen nibs, a pencil nib, a small pencil, a ruler, etc. There were also some loose items, including manuscripts, which will stay with the desk. These materials may have actually belonged to Evie, whereas the desk objects may have belonged to Addie, as they seem to date earlier. All contents are a part of the museum collection, excluding some correspondence relating to the Maine Home for the Feeble Minded and Mary Parsons (See Box 54, Folder 13) and some other miscellaneous items (See Box 111, Folder 10).

*Processing Note: many of the items in the Weston Homestead properties were donated to the Maine State Museum in 1971.

Series explanations:

I. Correspondence

Because many of the letters were neatly addressed to the recipient, and included the original envelopes, we decided to have the correspondence reflect who it was addressed to, and then arrange within by person and/or date. The focus of the collection is Addie Bixby Weston, so the collection is arranged around her. First there is correspondence to her from her children (in order by birth), and then from her parents, and then her siblings (in order by birth), and others, including correspondence from her various publishers.

Following letters to Addie are letters to her children, parents, and siblings. (Organized by family member, then correspondence from "family," "friends," and then various writings, diaries, ephemera, etc.) Then follows Bixby correspondence, and general correspondence (correspondence not from recognizable Westons or Bixbys already in the collection). Each person also has folders with related items, such as clippings, calling cards, hair, etc.

Often the family letters are addressed to "Dear girls" or "Dear Ones…" so this archivist just randomly assigned the letter to a certain sibling. It may be worthwhile for the researcher to look through various siblings to find letters.

There are also letters that were circulated amongst the family members, so they are really from several different people – usually those were filed with the name of the first person that they were to and from.

Also, many of the letters are addressed to "Dear Cousin" or "Dear Friend" so some further research may be needed to determine exactly who the recipient would be. Likewise many letters were unsigned so some guesswork was needed. Some of the letters are fragments. In other words, more work can be done on the letters.

At the end of the original letters are typescript transcriptions of some of the letters, done by Barbara Hennig, granddaughter of Addie Weston (3.75 linear ft., Box 64-71). When looking for an example of the collection as a whole or for examples of transcription, please refer to this section of the correspondence series.

II. Photographs

Contains over 450 photographs of the Weston family including: Bixby, Weston, Parsons, Hopkins, Athearn, Morrill and Wood. The overall collection is alphabetically organized by last name. Within the photograph collection there are two photograph albums (one primarily Bixby, the other Weston) from the mid-19th century. Also included within the collection are 12 photograph albums created by Eunice Weston Todd from ca. 1939-1950/60 (These have been roughly chronologically organized into volumes). There is also a sub series of negatives that are replications of old photographs as well as images from Donald Weston's life including his military service overseas. There is also a sub series that focuses on the Weston Homestead and the surrounding areas of Madison, Norridgewock and the Kennebec River.

Biographical information supplied by Barbara Hennig can be found in the inventory below (photographs). What information wasn't provided by Barbara Hennig was researched by intern/volunteer Raminta Moore.

Photographic portraits were organized starting with the Theodore and Addie Weston family, their children and grandchildren [Boxes 72-74]. These were followed by photographs of Nathan Weston's descendants (Theodore's father) and Benjamin Weston's descendants (Theodore's grandfather), although there are no photographs of Hannah Weston, the tenth child of Benjamin [Boxes 75-77]. One box [Box 78], was in a box owned by Evie Weston and was labeled "Weston." It is unclear, however, exactly how these individuals relate to the Weston side of the family.

The next set of boxes contain portraits relating to Jotham Sewell Bixby's family (Addie's father), his children, followed by his siblings [**Boxes 79 – 80**]. Siblings of Jotham who are not represented in this collection include: Lucy Bixby Gilman, Amos Bixby, Sarah Bixby Wood and Selden Bixby. These boxes are followed by photographs of other Bixby relatives [**Boxes 81-82**]. The majority of these photographs came from a box belonging to Evie Weston, labeled "Bixby." Again, it is unclear how many of these individuals are related to the Bixby family. Also included are photographs of the 1884

Wood family reunion. It is assumed, that these individuals are related to Mary Wood Bixby, Jotham S. Bixby's wife and Addie Weston's mother. The final box of portraits contain photographs of friends and portraits of those who are not related to either the Bixbys or the Westons [Box 83].

This series also contains photographs of various geographic locations including: the Weston Homestead in Madison, Maine [Box 84], photographs of Madison, Norridgewock, and Kennebec River areas of Maine, photographs from other states, souvenir travel photographs, pets, other Maine areas, Maine ephemera, and unidentified residences [Box 85].

The final boxes in the series contain photograph albums and scrapbooks [Boxes 86, 87, 89 & 90]. There is also one box of negatives many of which were created from existing prints [Box 88] and one oversized box containing one scrapbook and miscellaneous portraits and geographic locations [Box 89].

*Processing Note: Intern Sarah Gillis met and consulted with Barbara Hennig for about 25% of the photograph collection (which was unidentified). Whatever images were identified as family, but were unable to be given names were by Ms. Hennig's discretion. Those who were deemed unrelated but important to the collection are sorted as such in the unrelated category. In the folders that are marked as 'Unidentified Related,' these are assumed family members according to Ms. Hennig. Those that were clearly Weston or Bixby, in her opinion, but were unidentifiable were foldered separately. Information regarding many of the relationships between those represented was researched by intern Raminta Moore.

III. Printed and manuscript materials

Includes Theodore Weston account books and related materials, David Parson's Civil War and physician records, Weston and Bixby genealogy, Weston Homestead papers, newspapers, school papers, ephemera (including calling cards and greeting cards), etc.

This section includes deeds relating to the Benjamin Weston, Nathan Weston, Theodore B. Weston, Nathan Wood and John Wood property, financial records for Addie and Theodore Weston, and property notes (possibly compiled by Barbara Hennig). Also contains the 1977 appraisal of the Weston Homestead Farm Corporation [Box 92]. There are also financial, legal, farm, estate, and various association documents relating to Theodore and Addie Weston [Boxes 93-98]. There are also logging and business records relating to Benjamin Jr. (1790-1862) and Nathan Weston (1796-1891). This part of the collection was originally organized by Donald W. Weston, great grandson of Nathan [Boxes 99-100].

Dr. David Parson's financial, medical, various associations and Civil War related items (mostly muster-in rolls, packets and equipage documentation) are located in [Boxes 101-104].

There are also items relating to John H. Wood and his businesses including dealing in wood, coal, etc. and dealer in boots, shoes and rubbers (also under the name Wood Brothers). There are also various letters relating to the Maine Militia and teaching (See **Box 105**). **Boxes 106 and 107** contain items from a wooden box, now located in the museum collection. The items from the box include various business receipts, some correspondence, keepsakes, cash books, loose diary pages, and three music books. It is unclear in some cases if items belong to John Wood or John Mason Wood. Many receipts were originally bundled together with yarn. Members of the family mentioned include John Wood, his wife Anna Gott Wood and their sons Artemas H., Nathan, and John Mason Wood. Artemas H. Wood is the father of Lizzie Wood who married George O. Weston.

Various printed matter housed in the collection include various invitations, calling cards, religious materials, scholastic materials, organizational materials [Boxes 108-111], sewing patterns [Box 112], and newspaper clippings related to the Bixby and Weston families [Box 121].

There are many scholastic items attributed to the Bixby sisters (Hattie, Lizzie, Emma, Addie and Belle). Several of the sisters were also teachers and it is possible, that some of the items may have been written by their students [Box 113 and 114]. Alice Weston's scholastic materials and teaching materials are also contained within the collection [Box 115 and 116].

The Weston and Bixby families both collected genealogical information regarding their respective family lineages and various family reunions [Boxes 117-120].
