Biographical Note: This collection of items, letters and photographs pertain to the Jones and Larrabee families. Both families were involved in the corn canning business in Portland in the mid-1850s. One factory was located on Riverside St. (now Larrabee Road), the other on Forest Ave. This collection was found in a house at 305 Danforth Street in Portland, Maine. The donor purchased the house from Rufus Jones in 1964.

Scope and Content: This collection consists of correspondence, family papers, photographs, a J. Winslow Jones Green Corn can label and an engraving of the J. Winslow Jones Portland factory.
